Professor Richard Wilkinson – Public Health Researcher



Richard studied economic history and the philosophy of science at the London School of Economics before training in epidemiology. From the 1970s onwards, his research focused on social class differences in death rates. He has played a formative role in international research on the social determinants of health and on the societal effects of income inequality. His books and papers have drawn attention to the tendency for societies with bigger income differences between rich and poor to have a higher prevalence of a wide range of health and social problems. Two of his books have been the subject of documentary films – one called *The Great Leveller* for the TV Channel 4 Equinox series broadcast in prime time in 1996 (to coincide with the publication of his *Unhealthy Societies*) and another, called *The Divide* (based on *The Spirit Level*) released in April 2016 and now available on Netflix.

Richard is now Professor Emeritus of Social Epidemiology at the University of Nottingham Medical School, Honorary Professor at University College London and Visiting Professor at the University of York. He wrote *The Spirit Level* with Kate Pickett, a best seller now available in 24 languages. It won the 2011 Political Studies Association Publication of the Year Award and the 2010 Bristol Festival of Ideas Prize. He co-founded The Equality Trust (with support from the Joseph Rowntree Charitable Trust). In 2013 Richard received Solidar's Silver Rose Award and received Community Access Unlimited's 'Humanitarian of the Year' Award. The Irish Cancer Society awarded him the 2014 Charles Cully Memorial medal, and he was the 2017 medalist of The Australian Society for Medical Research.

In the last few years he has given many hundreds of conference addresses and media interviews round the world, including at WHO, the EU, OECD and the World Bank.

Dr. Frank Lehmann,

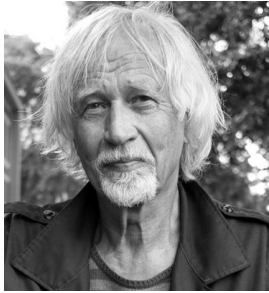
MPH Representative for Fundamentals of Health Promotion and Prevention at the Federal Centre for Health Promotion and Health Education (BZgA), Germany, on behalf of the Ministry of Health.

Frank is a medical doctor and holds a master's degree in Public Health. His fields of interest and expertise are health equity, health in all policies, the WHO's setting approach and population-wide strategies for health. Some steps in his biography are: Medical Advisor in Benin, West Africa (Primary Health Care, WHO); leader of an interdisciplinary health promotion institute and consultant in the "CME and Health Promotion" Department of the German Medical Association; since 2001, he is working at the BZgA.

He built up the German "Equity in Health" Network (Kooperationsverbund "Gesundheitliche Chancengleichheit"). In this network, more than 70 German health and welfare organisations are participating. They have a nationwide structure with coordination points in all 16 German federal states (Länder). They developed good practice criteria promoting health for socially disadvantaged groups which became main elements of the German prevention law. The next step is to develop integrated strategies of Health Promotion for all municipalities in Germany. The German Network "Equity in Health" took part in many international projects, mostly in cooperation with EHN.

Since 2018, Frank's main responsibility as Representative for Fundamentals of Health Promotion and Prevention at the BZgA is to support the implementation of a nationwide strategy of health promotion and disease prevention. This strategy is based on the "multi-level program with context reference" (Advisory Board for the German Health Sector): the population (macro) level comprises national policies and communication (i.e. campaigns). At the setting (Meso) level, there is the WHO setting approach in municipalities. The individual (Micro) level encompasses consultations, counselling, brochures, internet communication, etc. The most important issue is that the different levels are coordinated and evaluated.

Dr. Wolfgang Wodarg



Dr. med. Wolfgang Wodarg is an internist, pulmonologist, social doctor, doctor of hygiene and environmental medicine and was for many years head of a health department.

From 1994 to 2009 he was a Member of Parliament for the SPD in the Bundestag and their initiator and spokesman of the Enquetekommission Ethics and Law of Modern Medicine. He was also Deputy Chairman of the Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe and Chairman of the Subcommittee on Health.

Now he works as a university teacher in Berlin and Flensburg and on a voluntary basis as a board member at Transparency International Germany.

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
